

The \$1.2 billion project involves the construction by Ghella Abergeldie Joint Venture (GAJV) of a tunnel – and associated infrastructure – stretching over 13 kilometres from Western Springs to the Mangere Wastewater Treatment Plant, CIM Members get the good oil on collecting wastewater along the way via sewers and drop Auckland 'Central Inceptor' and shafts. network post event.
