Big data, artificial intelligence and robotics are now familiar terms. How does this impact the civil and construction industry? Is your business in step with the changes to make the most of what advancements in technology have on offer? Here's a few stats to get you thinking.

1. 'Robot labour' is set to change many aspects of the construction industry with automated technology set to replace 75% of jobs in the future.

2. The Internet of Things (IoT) is revolutionising the digital connectivity. As per the Commonwealth Scientific and Industrial Research Organisation (CSIRO) there will be an estimated 200 billion connected devices by 2020. The current number is 15 billion. This enhanced adoption of digital technology has already saved costs, increased productivity and improved safety in the construction industry.

3. Prefabricated building manufacturing is expected to grow at 5% per annum in Australia.

4. Estimating software and planning tools are used by 40% of corporate executives


Michael has recently been elected as the President of the Boards of the Institute of Civil Infrastructure and Civil Contractors Federation NSW.
